Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Ryan Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was not given a label for the 22-23 school year.

It is essential to address Ryan Elementary's gaps in the overall proficiency of our students. The Ryan staff has recently adopted a new textbook and is in the process of realigning the standards, which will reinvigorate our Tier 1 instruction. This realignment presents an opportunity for the school to be strategic with the highly structured intervention blocks for both English Language Arts and Math. The realignment of Tier 1 instruction, combined with the structured intervention blocks, demonstrates a proactive approach to addressing the proficiency struggle and signifies a commitment to enhancing the educational experience for all students at Ryan Elementary.

### **Process for Assigning Students to the School**

Ryan Elementary is the only elementary school in the Bronson Community School District that services students in grades three, four, and five. Students are assigned to the school based on their age and the grade level they will be attending. Students are assigned to particular classroom teachers based on the total number of students in that particular grade level, dividing them evenly by gender, academic performance, and social/emotional needs.

## The Status of the 3-5 Year School Improvement Plan

Ryan Elementary is currently in the second year of the current continuous improvement cycle. The School Improvement Team gathered data, academic, demographic, and social-emotional, to determine our goals for the 2023-2024 school year. The overarching umbrella for our improvement efforts will focus on engagement. Engagement has been broken down into the following subcategories: Family Engagement, Technology Use, and Student Engagement/Classroom Instruction.
